
B: SOCIAL INTERACTION WITH OTHERS

Homeschooling an Introvert

- How many of you are homeschooling an introvert?

What If I Am the Introvert?

- If you, the parent/teacher are the introvert, how can you provide your child with opportunities for socialization?
 - ► There are lots of opportunities for extra curricular activities such as dance lessons, music lessons, art lessons, summer camps, clubs, etc.
 - ▶ You may have to step out of your comfort zone!
 - ► Co-ops, homeschool days at museums or the zoo, Vacation Bible School, Scouts, play days, field trips.
 - ▶ Look for smaller groups for play days and field trips so you get the benefit of socialization without being overwhelmed.
 - ▶ Find another homeschooling mom who can make the homeschool journey with you.

Quantity is not the same as quality! Your child doesn't have to be involved in a huge number of group activities to be well socializated.

How should you respond to the socialization question?

- ▶ It's true that those who firmly believe only the public school system can teach your child to be properly socialized will not be swayed by much of anything you can say to them.
- ▶ Here is what you need to consider:
 - ▶ Did God call you to homeschool your children?
 - Are you obligated to "prove" that your children are well socialized?
 - ▶ Remember your "why."

- ▶ If you find that someone is truly curious or that the person wants more information about homeschooling and the social opportunities that our children have, you may want to share some of these things:
 - ▶ Your own reasons and goals for homeschooling.
 - ▶ Your children's social experiences/outlets.
 - ▶ Your own observations about the socialization of the majority of homeschoolers.
